Intermediate treatments (thinning) are designed to enhance growth, quality, vigor, and composition of the stand after establishment or regeneration and prior to final harvest. The goal of this special issue is to provide a platform for scientists and academicians all over the world to promote, share, and discuss various new issues and developments in the area of **Silvicultures**.

In this special issue, we invite front-line researchers and authors to submit original research and review articles that explore **Silvicultures**. In this special issue, potential topics include, but are not limited to:
